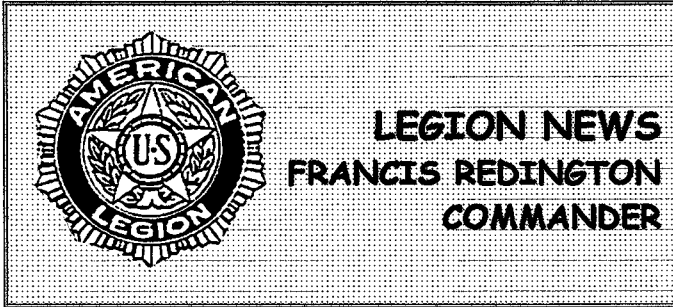

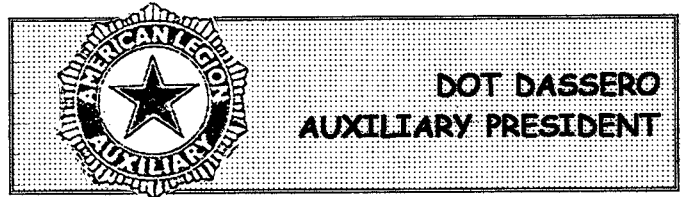

## PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Centennial Post owns approximately seven acres of prime real estate located on the corner of Austin Bluffs parkway and Old Farm Road. Plans are for a Post Home to be built on this property. This land currently requires minimal maintenance, i.e. cutting grass, weeds and other vegetation and removing accumulated trash.

Commander Redington, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Commander Moyer and I spent Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup> doing this maintenance. 1. The city of Colorado Springs has contacted us with concerns in the area of health and safety on the property that is adjoining the housing areas of Austin Bluffs and Old Farm Road.
2. As a result of this concern, we have walked the property to determine the problem areas and how to correct them.
3. As a result of our review, it looks like lawn clippings, debris, construction materials and numerous branches have been thrown over the fences and dumped at random areas on the property.
4. We are planning a cleanup on Saturday, September 23, from 8 a.m. until however long it takes to accomplish the task.
5. We are asking that if you have thrown debris over the fence, please help us clean it up. We would like to remind everyone that this property is not a dumping area and that in the future, we will be monitoring the property according to city policies.
6. We plan to have a dumpster and a skid loader for heavy and large materials. We will also have several pickup trucks to transport debris to the dumpster from September 22-25.
7. In addition to the cleanup activity, we are planning a small barbeque between 12 and 1 p.m. for the area residence. This is designed to allow us to meet you and give you a chance to meet some of our members.
