#### NEW DISEASES LINKED TO AGENT ORANGE from the Gazette Telegraph

The Department of Veterans Affairs has added more diseases to the list that entitle affected Vietnam veterans to compensation for their exposure to Agent Orange.

A study by the National Academy of Sciences said there is conclusive evidence linking Agent Orange exposure to five diseases—three types of cancer and two types of disorders. As a result of the study, other disorders will be added to the Agent Orange compensation list...Hodgkin's disease, a type of cancer, and a metabolic disorder called porphyria cutanea tarda.

Also, Vietnam veterans who develop respiratory cancers certain multiple myeloma will qualify for disability benefits based presumed exposure to the herbicide. This action covers cancers of the lung, larynx and trachea as well as Other diseases multiple myeloma. officially linked are soft-tissue sarcoma, non-hodgkins lymphoma and chloracne.

## VA HEALTH PROGRAMS FOR WOMEN from DVA Pamph 1et

There are now veteran health programs including sexual trauma and counseling services available to women veterans. The Women Vetrans Health Program includes: Priority

outpatient counseling services and related health care services and education on the normal and expected responses to sexual trauma, assessment of the specific problem(s), and treatment to assist with restoring physical and emotional health.

### RETIREE/FAMILY CLINIC OPENS from The Falcon Flyer

The United States Air Force Academy has opened a new clinic for Retirees and family members. As health care becomes increasingly expensive for the older segment of American society, the Armed Services are trying to improve care, increase accessibility and reduce costs for their former members.

Retirees and their dependents will find a clinic tailored to their needs under the Pikes Peak Region Gateway to Care program, an Army-Air Force cooperative health care effort.

The Retiree Family Clinic provides primary care and is located at the United States Air Force Academy Hospital, serving all retirees within a 40 mile radius. Health care finders stationed at the clinic help retirees and their dependents arrange for specialty care when necessary.



Dear Legionnaires and members of The American Legion Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion.

I appreciate the wonderful response I received to my last letter about the future of our post. The attendance at the general membership meeting on October 21 was great. I also received several letters and phone calls from those unable to attend expressing their views.

After a presentation by the post finance officer and a lively and informative discussion a motion was made and carried to allow the lease on the current post location to expire on January 31, 1994. The post will enter a period of financial regrouping with emphasis on saving money to eventually establish a post home of which we can be proud. The sentiment most strongly exhibited at the meeting was that money spent on rental is money wasted. I concur. I also agree with the view expressed by many members that we cannot afford to continue operation of a club/bar that is losing money. This operation has been subsidized by the post for some time at the expense of supporting American Legion programs and other activities more deserving of our financial assistance.

As a result of the opinions expressed in the meeting, I decided to close the club immediately. I spoke with several members of the Executive Board and they concurred in this action. This closing will result in an approximate savings of \$8,000.00 between now and January 31. I apologize for any inconvenience this may cause anyone. All commitments made to individuals and organizations using the post until January 31 will be honored. In the months remaining until the end of the lease, there are things that can be accomplished with volunteer assistance. It is possible for the club/bar to operate on a limited basis for special occasions. Any activity would, of course, be coordinated by the Club Committee and operated by volunteers.

I have been addressed by many members of our American Legion family organizations since Thursday night. I am pleased to report that the overwhelming majority of these members support our actions and have offered their assistance.

I feel that we are on the road to establishing one of the most successful posts in the American Legion. Now that I have the guidance of the membership and the assistance of many who have expressed their commitment to get involved, I see no boundaries to what we can accomplish. We are beginning a new era in the history of American Legion Centennial Post 209. Let us move forward with confidence.

I urge all of you to remain involved in this post, and I look forward to serving with you in supporting the goals of the post and the programs of The American Legion.
