

The sport came to the National level in 1991, and was held at the Olympic Training Center Shooting Facility. In 1991 there were only a few hundred

competitors for the 24 positions of the National Championships, 12

in Precision Class and 12 in the Sporter Class. In 1998 there were 2,500 to 3,000 competing for the twenty four positions in the National Championships. Each year the numbers increase making it more competitive to qualify for the Nationals. Ever since the initial National records were set, these youngsters keep setting new The Junior records.
