COLD INJURY FROM: "THE CHOISIN FEW"

Combat veterans of the Korean War are becoming increasingly crippled by the delayed timebomb consequences of cold injury wounds suffered during prolonged exposure suffered during prolonged exposure to temperatures 20 to 40 degrees below zero Fahrenheit - equivalent to - 116F and extremely lower by modern wind chill factors.

The savage cold killed cells, tissue and nerves, causing irreversible destruction that progressively worsens throughout life. Death or loss of extremeties were near-term results. The long-term aftermath - known medically as sequela - is continual deterioration of health, from intensifying chronic pain to vascular failures to deformities.

Freeze wounds, or frostbite, are as deadly as bullets or shrapnel, only that, they continue to worsen throughout the life of the victim.

The delayed long-term consequences of cold injuries were little known until 1957 when they were identified as a "medical problem of severe magnitude" in the Journal of the American Medical Association.

The consequences are life-long and severely debilitating. A grim outlook in even mild cases.

COLD INJURY (CONT)

All long-term symptoms are more severe than original findings indicate - even in personnel who experienced only moderate cold injury.

Eighteen to thirty years after the exposure a great alternation occurs and the symptoms become worse. After age fifty. there is a remarkable worsening with the deterioration progressing rapidly.
