Lower Food Costs

A family or individual can lower monthly food costs by participating in the SHARE program. The program covers the states of Colorado, New Mexico, Nebraska, Wyoming and South Dakota. Normally people can save about 50% on food through the SHARE Program from retail costs in a local market. Also, "...for every dollar you spend with SHARE you automatically help put food on the table for families and children in need right in your own community, plus help support local community programs."

Monthly regular, junior, vegetable and individual special items or packs are normally offered. Participants pre-order and pay, then pick up their orders at a host site a few weeks later. They can also go to the SHARE Denver warehouse most days of the week and purchase what they need. SHARE buys in large quantities, and then through a volunteer force of thousands, distributes the food items locally to participants. The SHARE program is available and open to anyone regardless of social or economic status.

Interested in lowering your food costs? Locate a local host site near where you live and contact that site representative for order and pickup dates.
